# Horses receiving medical treatment at a show.

Refer to rule 2.8 (c)

In the event a horse requires medical treatment once it has arrived at an event, and or whilst on the grounds during the event, the horse may compete in the event ONLY once the attending Veterinarian has signed a vet certificate. This certificate listing the information required under the above rule must be given to the Show Secretary or Manager PRIOR to that horse competing.

# Do your classes match those sent to the AQHA?

Please ensure that the list of classes provided at your event match those given to the AQHA for approval. Not only will this ensure you are covered by our insurance but also will allow your show to run smoothly and timely. It is also in respect of your judge that they are aware of all the classes you will be holding

# Heads up!

It seems there have been a few competitors entering classes without the correct attire. Please note the correct attire for the following classes:-

- (a) Hunter in Hand a collared polo shirt or dress shirt, minimum of a short sleeve, black or white, no patterns. Cream, brown, blue or black dress pants loose enough to run in, jodhpurs may be worn but NO jeans. Running shoes, elastic sided paddock boots or top boots. Vests and ties (no pattern) gloves and hats optional, and belts must be plain. (refer rule 88.2)
- (b) Ranch Riding A well-shaped western hat, western boots, jeans, a collared shirt with long sleeves. Chaps and Chinks are optional.
